Bob suggested, since the fair is in a good place financially right now, that they each receive a \$2,000.00 bonus. Rob Sidley made a motion to approve the bonuses. Dick Parker seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion passed. Michelle and Dave would like to thank the Fair Board for not only the bonus but also for the confidence in them.

- -Cattle-Sheep-Swine-Goats: Rich Van Pelt reported that the Milking Parlor passed inspection.
- **-4-H Livestock Auction:** Todd Demshar reported that extra Livestock yard signs are here if anyone would like to take one.
- -Concessions: Cindy Woodman reported that ice for the Fair Board will be delivered. She needs some locks for it.
- **-Decorations:** Ladies Auxiliary President Judy Parker reported Ladies Auxiliary is in the process of decorating.
- **-Entertainment**: Line painting of the Pits will be done on Monday. Scanners will be used in the Pits to read tickets for the Demo Derby.
- -Fine Arts: Jerry Merhar reported that entries are low this year. He will have dinner for the Fine Arts staff Saturday at 4:00. All Fair Board members are welcome.
  - -Golf Carts: Royce Gregory reported that golf carts are coming in Friday and Saturday.
- -Grounds: Wade Crofoot reported cracks have been filled by the grandstands. Dick is bringing in a machine for the weights. Various equipment will be brought in from the County, Painesville Township, Perry Township, The County Landfill and MFG. Mikes Salvage will be bringing wrecked cars for the Monster Truck show.
